- Lists of formulas or glossary of terms
- Links to data, charts, maps
- Access to multimedia

• The device's camera, which acts like a scanner when reading a QR code



- Allows use of Maltese fonts


Incorporation into eTwinning projects


- Students from different schools and countries can co-create visual resources to:

 - Disseminate the outcomes or process of the project


Slides vs Powerpoint


- Google slides is very similar to powerpoint so rather than going through how to use Slides as a program, I will be sharing some features which are idela for collaboration
- Although you can collaborate on a powerpoint too, googleslides is an online tool which enables live editing and viewing between participants.




















